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HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE IN VA

1. PURPOSE

This Veterans Health Administration (VHA) directive memorializes VHA's longstanding practice of allowing VA health care professionals to deliver health care to the official attestation by a professional organization that one has fulfilled the requirements or met a standard or skill to practice the profession.

b. <u>Health Care Professional</u> . The term health care professional is an individual who:

4. POLICY

a. It is VHA policy that VA health care professionals are permitted to practice in any State within the scope of their VA employment in any VA medical facility, regardless of the State where the professional is licensed, registered, or certified.

b. It is VHA policy to encourage Veterans Integrated Service Networks (VISN) Directors and VA medical facilities, to the maximum extent practicable, to allow health care professionals to practice and operate within the full scope of the of the license, registration, or certification that the individual holds. VISN and VA medical facility Directors are strongly encouraged to use health care professionals to the full scope of their license to address access shortages of certain health care professions and other issues relevant to the delivery of health care to VA beneficiaries.

5. RESPONSIBILITIES

a. <u>Under Secretary for Health</u>. The Veterans Health Administration (VHA) Under Secretary for Health is responsible for

(1) Ensuring overall VHA compliance with this directive; and

(2) Reviewing reports from the Director of the Office of Regulatory and Administrative Affairs (ORAA) of external actions initiated, pending, or completed by a State or State Licensing Board against VA health care professionals regarding their State license, registration, or certification as a result of practicing across State lines in compliance with this directive.

b. <u>Deputy Under Secr etary for Health for Policy and Services</u>. The Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Policy and Services is responsible for overseeing VHA compliance with and implementation of this directive.

c. <u>Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Operations and Management</u>. The Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Operations and Management is responsible for:

(1) Communicating the contents of this directive to all VISN

regarding their State license, registration, or certification for practicing across state lines in compliance with this directive into one report no less than every 3 months, with the first report due no later

6. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE OF PSYCHOLOGISTS

This directive allows psychologists to practice and operate within the full scope of the license, registration, or certification they hold. The "full scope of the license" is defined by the specifics of the licensure law in the State in which the psychologist is licensed and by the Psychologist Qualification Standards (VA Handbook 5005/103, dated April 15, 2002, see Part II, Appendix G18, dated February 7, 2018).

1. As noted in paragraph 3.a.(1) of the Psychologist Qualification Standards, "professional psychology practice" includes but is not limited to the following psychology-oriented job duties: providing professional clinical services, conducting research, carrying out education and training activities, carrying out program evaluation activities, clinical consultation, supervision and administration.

2. In VHA, "professional psychology practice" does not include allowing a psychologist to prescribe medications, even if such psychologist's State Psychology licensure permits prescribing.
